Greetings and Welcome to May! You should have received our email about the John Ball Zoo Field Trip on May 21st. Let your daughter/son's 1st hour teacher know if you are interested in chaperoning this adventure. We must have 4 chaperones per class in order to make sure that we can attend. Please fill out the background check form linked in the email if you have not already done so this school year. In ELA we are wrapping up our reading of *The Boy* Who Harnessed the Wind. We will continue to analyze word choice, figurative language, and text structure as well as identify the central idea of a text. To end our current unit of study we will discuss and practice the use of effective and efficient research strategies by taking a look at inventions that have had a direct impact on a critical issue faced by different communities. Our final required book review is due on May 22nd. All students, even if they are finished with these reviews, should continue to read at home and have a book to read here at school.

Science classes continue their study of our Universe, with the focus on the Moon's phases.

In math class, we are nearing the end of Unit 7, the penultimate unit for 6th grade! Students are developing their skills in graphing points on a coordinate plane. There are many fun lessons found on the Google Classroom that your student can show you. Your student can expect to have a test early next week.

# 7<sup>th</sup> Grade News:

Mr. Huizenga's Science classes will be completing the Waves Unit with the Electromagnetic Spectrum. Next, we will be completely switching gears for the remainder of the school year and studying Ecology, a great excuse to get outside and enjoy the warmer weather.

The English classes are working on their final performance task for Module Three. The performance task will be to create a museum exhibit related to a theme from the Harlem Renaissance. A makeshift museum will be created in the community room at the VAC during the week of May 20th.

#### 8th Grade News:

The Math classes are wrapping up Unit 6 soon. We have transitioned from solving equations to solving inequalities. We started with solving inequalities on a number line, and then solving equations in real-life situations such as managing money and temperatures. Students solved one-step equations and inequalities and progressed to multi-step equations and inequalities in word problems. power of water and how it changes the landscape.

Each student will get trained on how to water test various parameters like the number of Nitrates, Phosphates, Dissolved Oxygen, PH, Turbidity, bacteria counts and more as we take the class outdoors for a water testing field trip along the many creeks and tributaries of White Lake and the White River.

# *Elective's News:* Spotlight on Phys Ed

Students are currently participating in Presidential Physical Fitness Testing. Students will be assessing their endurance with the mile run, upper body strength with push-ups, core strength with sit-ups, flexibility with a sit-andreach exam, and speed/agility with a shuttle run test. These results will be compared against where students started the trimester when they did their pretesting.
