Whitehall District Schools Ealy Elementary and Shoreline Elementary 2024-25 School Year

Everyone benefits when schools, families, and the community come together around students to help them succeed. This plan outlines what Whitehall District Schools will do to promote Parent and Family Engagement at Ealy and Shoreline Elementaries. This plan will be updated annually with input from our families and school community.

Policy Involvement

At our annual meeting to be held on February 13, 2025, the Parent and Family Engagement Plan will be reviewed and input will be solicited. Additionally, parents have opportunities for involvement during PTO meetings which are held on the 2nd Fridays each month at 9:15.

Shared Responsibilities

Both Ealy and Shoreline Elementaries promote student achievement via shared school and parent responsibilities. These responsibilities can be found in the Parent-Student-School Compacts (<u>Ealy version</u>, <u>Shoreline version</u>). These compacts are discussed during conference check-ins in the fall. Updates on student progress are communicated through both report cards and notes from the interventionists.

Building Capacity

In order to assist parents with understanding of state standards, state and local assessments and the Title I plan, so they can better monitor their child's achievement the schools will provide the following:

- Report Cards January and June
- Progress Monitoring Communication

Both schools continue to train staff to work with parents as equal partners. These training shall occur during Focus Friday staff meetings the week before spring conferences. The schools will also work to continue to integrate Title I involvement with other programs, this year holding the Title I meeting as part of the Winter Social Event and having Title I as a regular agenda topic during PTO meetings. If there are other requests for additional support, the schools will document those and if feasible provide those supports.
